

angel/tart

We designed this little bag to have fun using two gorgeous yarns. It's reversible, because sometimes you feel like an angel, and sometimes you don't.

Materials

1 skein Lorna's Laces Angel (shown in shadow or cool)
1 skein K1C2 Tartelette (shown in pebbles)
1 yard or so of satin ribbon, with or without wire edges

1 set 4.5 mm US size 7 dpns

Gauges

Lorna's Laces – 20 stitches per 4"
Tartelette – 16 stitches per 4"

Instructions

With the Tartelette, cast on 44 stitches using the long-tail cast on method. Join, being careful not to twist, and divide evenly on 3 or 4 needles, whichever you prefer, making sure you have an even number of stitches on each needle. The long tail marks the place where each new round begins.

Instructions Continued

Round 1. Knit.

Round 2. K2tog, YO, repeat to end of round.

Round 3. Knit.

Continue in stockinette stitch (knitting every round) until entire piece measures 4.5" from the cast-on edge. Then begin the decrease rounds:

Round 1. Knit 9, K2tog, repeat to end of round

Round 2. Knit even.

Round 3. Knit 8, K2tog, repeat to end of round

Round 4. Knit even.

Round 5. Knit 7, K2tog, repeat to end of round

Round 6. Knit even.

Round 7. Knit 6, K2tog, repeat to end of round

Round 8. Knit even.

Round 9. Knit 5, K2tog, repeat to end of round

Round 10. Knit even.

Round 11. Knit 4, K2tog, repeat to end of round

Round 12. Knit even.

Round 13. Knit 3, K2tog, repeat to end of round

Round 14. Knit even.

Round 13. Knit 2, K2tog, repeat to end of round

Round 14. Knit even.

Round 13. Knit 1, K2tog, repeat to end of round

Round 14. Knit even.

Round 13. K2tog, repeat to end of round

Round 14. Knit even.

Bind off all stitches. Cut yarn and tuck the end through to the wrong side.

Work all ends in now, before continuing.

With RS facing out, and using Angel, pick up stitches around the cast-on Tartelette edge, as follows. Pick up 3 stitches, on the 4th stitch pick up two in the same stitch. Do this by picking up one in the back of the stitch and one in the front. Repeat this until you have picked up 55 total stitches. Divide stitches evenly on dpns.

Work in St st (knitting all rounds), until work measures 4.5" from the picked up edge. Then begin the decrease rounds.

Round 1. Knit 9, K2tog, repeat to end of round

Round 2. Knit even.

Round 3. Knit 8, K2tog, repeat to end of round

Round 4. Knit even.

Round 5. Knit 7, K2tog, repeat to end of round

Round 6. Knit even.

Round 7. Knit 6, K2tog, repeat to end of round

Round 8. Knit even.

Round 9. Knit 5, K2tog, repeat to end of round

Round 10. Knit even.

Round 11. Knit 4, K2tog, repeat to end of round

Instructions Continued

Round 12. Knit even.

Round 13. Knit 3, K2tog, repeat to end of round

Round 14. Knit even.

Round 13. Knit 2, K2tog, repeat to end of round

Round 14. Knit even.

Round 13. Knit 1, K2tog, repeat to end of round

Round 14. Knit even.

Round 13. K2tog, repeat to end of round

Round 14. Knit even.

Bind off all stitches. Cut yarn and work the end into the inside as best you can.

You now have an egg shape with pointed ends, ½ tartelette and ½ angel.

To finish, cut a piece of ribbon about 1 yard long, and weave it through the eyelet holes. If you wish, you can treat the ends of the ribbon with Fray Check, tie knots, and/or add beads.

To use the bag, invert one half (the angel or the tart, as desired) into the other and pull the ribbon to close.
